The Ministry Training Center exists to make disciples of Jesus Christ and serve them out to serve the Church.

PROGRAM EMPHASES

The Ministry Training Center is a paid internship program for masters-level seminary students. While we value the role of seminary, we believe the local church is the primary training ground and launching point for all church ministry.

Personal Mentorship

MTC Residents are disciples! Our ministry staff and church members pour into MTC Residents on a weekly basis.

Theological Integration

MTC Residents are students! We want residents to integrate their seminary learning into “real-world” church ministry.

Meaningful Experience

MTC Residents are disciple-makers! We want residents to lead and teach in a variety of ministry settings.

PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The Ministry Training Center has three terms each year (Spring, Summer, and Fall) to coincide with SEBTS EQUIP Classes. The program runs August through July and Residents must reapply each year. The MTC functions as a cohort and thus, Residents are required to participate for the full duration of the yearly cycle.

RESIDENT RESPONSIBILITIES, STIPEND, & HOUSING

Residents will become members of Fairview and are expected to participate in all aspects of church life. Apart from serving in all weekly gatherings, residents are only required to work on campus on Wednesdays. Residents may participate in the following activities each week:

1. EQUIP Class reading, homework, and discussion.
2. Discipleship groups with church members and other residents.
3. Reading and round-table discussion of ministry-related texts with pastors and staff.
4. Weekly sermon planning with the pastors.
5. Service in a variety of ministry areas.

MTC Residents will work 8-10 hours a week and will receive a modest stipend in order to help with seminary costs. We are also in the process of securing free housing for MTC Residents near our church so that they can better integrate into our church family.

SEMINARY COURSE CREDIT AND UPCOMING COURSES

In partnership with Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fairview Baptist Church is able to offer 36 hours of course credit through the EQUIP program. See eligible classes on page 4.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- *Q: Is the Ministry Training Center for men only?*
 - A: No! We desire to train up and send out both men and women to serve the church in a number of different capacities.

- *Q: Is the Ministry Training Center geared toward theological education or practical ministry experience?*
 - A: Both! We want our residents to be sharp but also to gain practical ministry experience. To this end, we make sure that all assigned reading and writing is oriented toward church ministry and does not overlap with assignments from Southeastern.

- *Q: How does an MTC Resident pay for their SEBTS tuition?*
 - A: Though SEBTS EQUIP courses are offered at Fairview and the instructor will be from Fairview, students pay the standard tuition rate directly to SEBTS. EQUIP Courses at Fairview do qualify as residential classes for the Charles B. Keesee grant.

- *Q: Are Residents placed in one area of ministry?*
 - A: No, we believe that students should serve in a variety of church ministries in order to be more experienced and well-rounded. Only Biblical Counseling Residents are placed in a single ministry area.

- *Q: How long can someone stay an MTC Resident at Fairview?*
 - A: Residents must re-apply for the MTC every year but there is no limit on how long a Resident may be invited to stay.
