DESCRIPTION

Perhaps no doctrine is more urgent for today's Christians to study than the doctrine of humanity. Nearly every cultural debate seems to hinge upon one's theological anthropology and its significance for daily life. In our contemporary age, there has been a loss of humanity's goodness, purpose, and end. How can we renew our understanding and see humanity the way God designed? In this equip class, Pastors Mike and Joseph will consider the biblical principles, theological formulations, and practical applications for a Christian doctrine of humanity.

OBJECTIVES AND OUTCOMES

A participant who successfully completes this class will be better prepared to worship the Triune God, serve Christ's Church, and fulfill the Great Commission by learning to do the following:

- 1. Learn the doctrine of the *imago dei* and its necessity for participation in God.
- 2. Understand the complex human constitution as embodied souls.
- 3. Develop an understanding of humanity as male and female.
- 4. Discern humanity's relationship to the rest of the created realm.
- 5. Apprehend the effects of Adam's sin and Christ's righteousness on humanity.
- 6. Apply an understanding of the class content with a greater love of God, responsibility in this world, and longing for heaven where we'll see Him as He is.
