# **DESCRIPTION**

Thomas Brooks once said "the power of religion and godliness lives, thrives, or dies as closet prayer lives, thrives, or dies." Perhaps no practice is more urgent for today's Christians than the practice of prayer. Yet, in our experience of prayer, we find ourselves overwhelmed with the day's tasks, distracted by our wandering minds, or stumbling in our speech because of sin. How can we renew our understanding and see prayer the way God designed as the air of our Christian existence? we will consider the biblical principles, theological formulations, and practical applications for the Christian practice of prayer.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND OUTCOMES**

A participant who successfully completes this class will be better prepared to worship the Triune God, serve Christ's Church, and fulfill the Great Commission by learning to do the following:

- 1. Learn the importance of prayer for communion with God.
- 2. Understand the nature of what prayer is.
- 3. Develop an understanding of the Chritian's private prayer life.
- 4. Discern ways to cultivate a public prayer life.
- 5. Apply an understanding of the class content with a greater love of God, responsibility in this world, and longing for heaven where we'll see Him as He is.
